Soft wash kit with bleach pump: For building a soft wash sprayer with tank for outdoor use with bleach**

A WARNING

READ and UNDERSTAND this Owner's Manual completely before using this sprayer.Assemble, test, and use only in accordance with this Owner's Manual instructions.

EXERCISE CAUTION when mixing chemicals as incorrect ratios or mixtures could release harmful gases.

READ and FOLLOW chemical label instructions.

KNOW emergency procedures BEFORE handling chemicals. Sprayer leaks, bodily chemical contact, poisoning, and spills require immediate response.

AVOID inhaling, ingesting, or coming into contact with any chemicals.

WEAR personal protective gear when filling, using, cleaning, and servicing the sprayer.

KEEP sprayer and spray materials away from children and pets. Some chemicals are especially toxic to them.

DO NOT TURN ON POWER to sprayer until ready to spray in order to avoid unintentional spray release.

SOAK vegetation in the area surrounding the work zone well prior to and after spraying bleach. Bleach can kill vegetation if not rinsed thoroughly.

ALWAYS keep a fire extinguisher rated "ABC" nearby.

Improper use of the sprayer or handling of chemicals could result in serious injury or illness to the operator or nearby persons/animals or could cause damage to the environment.

**This sprayer is recommended for use in spraying bleach. The sprayer will be damaged, and warranty voided if used to apply any petroleum-based product (gasoline, diesel, kerosene, or oil). The sprayer should not be used to transfer any product intended for human consumption. WE RECOMMEND THAT THE SPRAYER NOT BE USED FOR OTHER PURPOSES ONCE IT HAS BEEN USED FOR SPRAYING BLEACH. Any chemical will leave some residual in the tank liner or sprayer components, even after the sprayer has been properly cleaned. These residual chemicals can have unexpected effects on future uses. This sprayer should not be used by people with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge.

Hazard Signal Word Definitions

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Intended Use

The kit for building a sprayer is intended for use in spraying bleach concentrations of 3% or less.

SPRAYING CHEMICALS:

Hazardous chemicals must be handled with caution as directed throughout this manual and on the chemical label.

The sprayer is intended for use in spraying chemicals <u>in liquid form only</u>. The sprayer is NOT intended for use in spraying chemicals in dry or aerosolized form, or for use with fumigants.

Always flush the sprayer after each use to clean the chemical out of the pump, hoses, and spray gun. The life of the sprayer will be shortened if it is not flushed after each use.

WE RECOMMEND THAT THE SPRAYER NOT BE USED FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Any chemical will leave some residual in the tank liner or sprayer components, even after the sprayer has been properly cleaned. These residual chemicals can have unexpected effects on future uses.

<u>NOTE:</u> The sprayer will be damaged, and warranty voided, if used to apply any petroleum-based product (gasoline, diesel, kerosene, or oil).

NOTICE: Not for use on painted wood surfaces. Use only on hard, non-porous surfaces.

----- DURING ASSEMBLY -----

General Chemical Safety

- READ and FOLLOW all chemical label instructions and warnings.

- KNOW applicable licensing and regulatory requirements for the chemical you plan to use.
- KNOW emergency procedures before handling chemicals. Carefully review <u>Chemical Accident Procedures</u> listed below and later in this manual. Also see First Aid instructions on the chemical label.

Chemical Application Safety

Before Spraying

- DO NOT SPRAY when wind speed exceeds 5 MPH in order to minimize spray drift.
- CLEAR work area of people/ pets and POST warning notices to restrict access for the period recommended on chemical label.
- **SOAK** vegetation in the area surrounding the work zone prior to spraying bleach. Bleach can kill vegetation if not soaked thoroughly.
- **KEEP sprayer and spray materials away from children/pets**. Some chemicals can be especially toxic to children and animals.

During Spraying

- DO NOT OVERAPPLY chemicals. Apply at rate recommended by chemical manufacturer. Excess chemicals
 can be dangerous to humans and animals, damage desirable plants, and contaminate soil and water sources.

Assembly


Step One: Mounting

- This NorthStar pump is self-priming.
- The pump should be located in an area that is dry and provides adequate ventilation.

A CAUTION

DO NOT locate the motor near low temperature plastics or combustible material. The surface temperature of the motor may exceed 250°F [121°C].


• The pump may be mounted in any horizontal position. **DO NOT** mount pump vertically, doing so will prevent the Motor Armor system from operating correctly.



- Secure the rubber base with #10 fasteners. **DO NOT** compress the base, as doing so will reduce the ability to isolate vibration and noise.
- See specifications section for the mounting pattern & dimensions.

Step Two: Plumbing

- Remove shipping plugs from pump ports.
- Insert inlet strainer to the inlet quick connect port of the pump.
 - **NOTE:** To insert quick connect fittings, lubricate O-ring with water and twist fitting while inserting into pump port.
- Insert one quick connect fitting to the inlet strainer, and one quick connect fitting to the outlet port of the pump.
- Attach inlet hose (8ft. piece of hose) to the hose barb on the inlet side. Install with hose clamp. The other end of the inlet hose should be routed to a nearby water supply (i.e. water tank).
 - **NOTE:** Restrictions on the inlet may cause a loss in performance. Inlet pressure must not exceed 30 psi [2.1 bar]
- Attach one end of the gun hose (200ft. hose) to the hose barb on the outlet side of pump. Attach the other end of the gun hose to the spray gun. Install with hose clamps.
 - **NOTE:** An additional elbow fitting is included for different plumbing configurations on either the inlet or outlet.



Assembly

Step Three: Connect to battery or 12V DC supply.

WARNING

Batteries are hazardous because they contain caustic acid, can emit explosive gases, and can cause electric shock.

Caution must be exercised when making connections to a battery to avoid shock and contact with the acid, and to prevent any sparking that could lead to an explosion.

ALWAYS follow the safety instructions and steps listed below in *exact sequence* when connecting the sprayer's <u>wire harness</u> to the battery terminals.

1. Preparatory safety

Preparatory safety steps:

- ALWAYS use eye protection.
- NEVER smoke or work near sparks or other sources of ignition.
- NEVER touch both battery terminals at the same time or with any non-insulated tools.
- If battery acid contacts skin or clothing, flush immediately with water and neutralize with baking soda.

2. Electrical requirements

- The pump should be on a dedicated (individual) circuit. Do not use wires longer than those provided in the kit.
- The pump is protected with a fuse. Use an approved wire of the size specified or heavier.


3. Connect pump to battery

Connect the pump to a 12V DC battery using the following procedure:

- a) Disconnect the vehicle battery ground wire.
- b) Connect the <u>pump's red</u> wire to the *positive* (+) terminal of the battery.
- c) Connect the pump's *black* wire to the *negative* (-) terminal of the battery.
- d) Reconnect the vehicle battery ground wire.

Note: Skip steps (a) and (d) if battery is not in a vehicle.

WARNING: Always connect in this sequence to avoid possible shock.



4. Verify connection	Verify a complete connection has been made by checking with a DC voltmeter, or by <i>briefly</i> turning the ON/OFF switch on the pump and on the wire harness to the ON position and listening for pump activation.		
5. Disconnect after use	 AFTER EACH USE, disconnect power to the pump using the following procedure a) Disconnect the vehicle battery ground wire. b) Disconnect the pump's black wire from the negative (-) terminal of the battery. c) Disconnect the pump's red wire from the positive (+) terminal of the battery. d) Reconnect the vehicle battery ground wire. Note: Skip steps (a) and (d) if battery is not in a vehicle. WARNING: Always disconnect in this sequence to avoid possible shock. NOTE: It is important to disconnect power to the pump when not in use for safety reasons. ALWAYS verify that the power has been disconnected before adding chemicals or servicing. 		

Assembly

Step Four: Affix chemical warning decal.

- Peel chemical warning decal off of paper backing
- Attach chemical warning decal to supply tank or other visible surface on the soft wash system.

Step Five: Check and test completed assembly.


Check and test completed assembly

Serious injury could result from chemical leaks if sprayer is improperly assembled or the design of the sprayer is modified.

Follow the steps below to ensure the sprayer is properly assembled. Never modify the sprayer's design.

1. Check assembly	Check assembly to assure the pump is properly assembled and in safe		
	working condition:		
2. Test with water	Test the system for leaks with water:		
	a) Fill the tank with water.b) The pump is an "on demand" pump. When turned on, the pump will prime itself, then turn off once reaching pressure. When the flow continues, the pump will automatically re-start.c) Check for leaks throughout the system. If a leak is detected, fix the leak and retest the system with water.		

Features



- 1. **Motor Armor System.** This system will shut the pump off in the event of a leak inside the pump cartridge to prevent damage to the motor.
- 2. ON/OFF Switch. Allows the operator to turn the pump on and off.
- 3. LED. Red LED illuminates when there is a fluid leak inside the pump cartridge.
- **4. Pressure Switch.** The pressure switch reacts to pressure, and interrupts power at the preset shut-off pressure indicated on the pump label. When outlet pressure drops below a predetermined limit, the switch will close, and the pump operates until the shut-off pressure is achieved. The shut-off pressure is set to factory calibrated standards.
- 5. Quick Connect Ports. Allows quick and easy fitting removal.
- **6. Pump Cartridge.** The portion of the pump that moves fluid. Quickly and easily replace the low-cost consumable pump cartridge once it is worn or leaking.
- 7. **Spray Gun.** Use the spray gun to apply chemical to specific areas. When the pump ON/OFF switch is in the ON position, the spray gun trigger is the pump ON/OFF control. Squeeze the trigger and the pump turns on, let go and the pump turns off.
- **8. Spray Nozzle.** Quick connect allows easy change to different nozzle tips.
- **9. Wire Harness.** The wire harness connects the battery to the pump. The in-line switch allows the operator to turn the pump on and off.
- **10. Suction Strainer.** The suction strainer protects the pump from debris and has a clear removable bowl for easy cleaning.

Operation – Important Safety Information

Now that you have completed and tested your assembly, there is some important safety and health information you need to know with regard to handling and spraying chemicals.

▲ WARNING

Carefully read and make sure you understand the following safety information before using the sprayer.

General Chemical Safety:

A WARNING

- Heed the warnings below and follow all instructions carefully.
- Improper handling of chemicals can result in serious injury or illness, or cause damage to the environment.
- Chemical label. ALWAYS READ and FOLLOW all chemical label instructions.
- **Licensing/regulation**. Refer to any applicable licensing restrictions or state/federal regulations with regard to the application of the particular chemical you plan to use.
- **Emergency procedures**. Before handling chemicals, carefully review the <u>Chemical Accident Procedures</u> listed later in this section, as well as the Statement of Practical Treatment on the chemical label.
- **Inhalation/contact**. ALWAYS take precautions to avoid inhaling or coming into contact with the chemical.
- **Personal protective equipment**. ALWAYS wear protective clothing, eye protection, and chemical-resistant gloves when filling, using, and cleaning the sprayer. Wear additional protective gear (such as facemask or apron) as recommended on the chemical label.
- Children/pets. Some chemicals can be especially toxic to children and animals. ALWAYS exercise extra caution around children. Keep sprayer and all spray materials away from children and animals.
- Ventilation. ALWAYS ensure there is adequate ventilation when mixing, pouring, or spraying.
- Flammables. NEVER use any flammable chemicals in the sprayer.
- Chemical interaction. ALWAYS flush the sprayer before switching chemicals. Different chemicals may interact dangerously with each other.
- Chemical storage. ALWAYS store chemicals in a properly labeled container and in a secure location per the manufacturer's recommendations.
- **Health monitoring**. Monitor the health of operators who are frequently exposed to chemicals, as recommended by the chemical label or local/federal regulations.

Operation – Important Safety Information (continued)

Chemical Application Safety:

A WARNING

- Caution must be used when spraying chemicals to avoid unsafe exposure to humans and the environment.
- Heed the warnings below and follow all instructions carefully.

Before Spraying

- Soak. ALWAYS soak vegetation in the area surrounding the work zone before spraying bleach. Bleach can kill vegetation if not soaked thoroughly.
- **Sprayer prep**. ALWAYS inspect and prepare the sprayer before use according to the directions provided in this manual.
- **Keep sprayer off.** Do not turn on power to the sprayer until ready to spray in order to avoid unintentional spray release.
- **Wind speed**. NEVER spray when wind speed exceeds 5 MPH in order to minimize spray drift.
- Clear area/post. ALWAYS keep the work area clear of people and pets. POST warning notices to restrict access by the public for the period recommended on chemical label.
- **Operator age**. You must be 16 years of age or older to operate this sprayer. Some chemicals are especially toxic to children.

During Spraying

- Over application. DO NOT over-apply chemicals. Apply at a rate recommended by chemical manufacturer. Excess chemical can be dangerous to humans, damage desirable plants, and contaminate soil and water sources.
- Never point gun. NEVER point the spray gun at people or animals.
- **Children/pets**. ALWAYS exercise extra caution when spraying near areas accessible to children and pets.
- **Eating/smoking**. DO NOT eat, drink, smoke, rub your eyes, or touch any part of your bare skin while handling chemicals and spraying.
- **Heat/flames**. DO NOT spray near open flames or sources of heat.
- Spills. ALWAYS clean up spills immediately per instructions on the chemical label.
- **Unattended**. ALWAYS turn off power to sprayer and relieve system pressure before leaving sprayer unattended.
- **Troubleshooting**. ALWAYS refer to the safety instructions in the Troubleshooting Section before attempting any repairs.

After Spraying

- **Soak.** ALWAYS soak vegetation in the area surrounding the work zone after spraying bleach. Bleach can kill vegetation if not soaked thoroughly.
- **Clean sprayer**. ALWAYS clean the sprayer immediately after use according to the directions provided in this manual.
- **Decontaminate**. ALWAYS decontaminate yourself immediately after you are finished spraying and handling chemicals. Wash all exposed areas of the body with soap and water and remove and launder clothing.
- Chemical disposal/storage. ALWAYS dispose of or store remaining chemicals properly as recommended on the chemical label.

Operation – Important Safety Information (continued)

Chemical accident procedures:

A WARNING

Before you fill the sprayer, review the following information with regard to handling accidents. Chemical spills, sprayer leaks, personal contamination, and poisoning are accident situations which you may encounter. All require an immediate response – See instructions below.

Sprayer leak

In the event that the sprayer develops a leak while spraying chemicals, you must *immediately stop spraying*.

Turn off power to the sprayer and follow the directions below, as applicable.

If the leak is internal in the pump cartridge, the pump will automatically shut off, and the indicator light will turn on.

The pump will not turn back on until the pump cartridge has been replaced and there is no leaking present.

Bodily chemical contact

Personal contamination can occur when chemicals splash, spill, or spray directly onto a person.

1. Follow the emergency first aid instructions on the chemical label listed in the First Aid or Statements of Practical Treatment sections.

General procedures for contact with bleach or surfactant includes:

- a) Eyes immediately rinse with water for 15 minutes. If irritation persists, contact a doctor.
- b) Skin rinse all contaminated skin surfaces with water. If irritation persists, contact a doctor.
- c) Clothing remove contaminated clothing. Dispose of heavily contaminated clothing per chemical label instructions.
- 2. Seek medical advice if instructed on the label, or if the victim experiences symptoms of harmful effects such as burning, swelling, nausea, chest pain, difficulty breathing, dizziness, or confusion. When seeking medical advice, be sure to bring the chemical product label.

Poisoning by ingestion or inhalation

In case of poisoning from ingestion or inhalation:

IF THE VICTIM HAS COLLAPSED OR IS NOT BREATHING, <u>CALL</u> 911. Otherwise:

- 1. If you are the victim, immediately seek assistance from nearby personnel because you may become incapacitated.
- 2. Follow the emergency first aid instructions on the chemical label in the First Aid or Statement of Practical Treatment sections.

<u>General procedures for ingestion or inhalation of bleach or surfactant includes:</u>

- c) For ingestion: Drink a glass of water. Call a doctor or poison control center. DO NOT induce vomiting unless instructed to do so by a doctor or poison control center.
- d) For inhalation: Immediately move to fresh air.
- 3. Call a poison control center for further advice. In the U.S., call 1-800-222-1222 to be automatically linked to the nearest certified poison control center. Have the chemical label available for reference.

Operation – Important Safety Information (continued)

Chemical spills

Chemical spills must be quickly contained and properly cleaned up.

Refer to the chemical label for any specific clean-up instructions with regard to the chemical spilled.

General procedures include:

- 1. **Control** the spill by stopping the source of the spill. If the source of the spill is a container leak, place the leaking container in a larger, watertight container. Keep unprotected people away from the spill site.
- 2. **Contain** the spill so that it does not spread and get into water sources. Use a shovel or other tool to make a dike around the spill with soil, sod, or absorbent material.
- 3. **Clean up** the spill immediately. Absorbent materials like ground corncobs or pet litter should be spread on the spill area to soak up the chemical. The contaminated material should then be shoveled into a leak proof container. Do not flush the spill area with water until you receive advice as directed below.
- 4. **Seek additional advice** from the chemical manufacturer and your state's pesticide regulatory agency regarding decontamination of the spill site:
 - *Chemical manufacturer*. The chemical label provides contact information for the chemical manufacturer.
 - *State pesticide regulatory agency*. In the U.S., call the National Pesticide Information Center at 1-800-858-7378 for assistance in determining how to contact your state's pesticide regulatory agency.

Operation – Preparing the Sprayer for Each Use

If the sprayer has been used previously, it must be prepared BEFORE EACH SUBSEQUENT USE.

A WARNING

- Read instructions below carefully for inspecting and preparing the sprayer.
- Damaged or clogged equipment could result in leaks or uncontrolled spray.
- Leaks could result in injury to the operator or bystanders from chemical exposure or cause damage to the environment.

Important safety rules:

- **Power off.** Make sure all power is OFF before cleaning, inspecting, or servicing the sprayer.
- Guards / shields. Make sure all guards and shields are replaced after servicing the sprayer.
- **Replacement parts.** If a part needs replacement, only use parts that meet the manufacturer's specifications. Replacement parts that do not meet specifications may result in a safety hazard or poor operation of the sprayer.

Operation – Using the Sprayer

Step 1: Assess wind conditions and clear work area.

Before you decide to spray, you must determine whether wind conditions are suitable. You must also restrict access to the work area to ensure the safety of bystanders.

Do not spray if wind speeds are greater than 5 MPH or if there are bystanders in the intended spray area.



Step 4: Clean sprayer and decontaminate after use.

When finished using the sprayer, it is important to clean the sprayer and decontaminate yourself. Do not store the sprayer with chemicals in the tank, as it is unsafe and could also result in damage to the equipment.

- Clean-up and decontamination procedures must be followed after each use.
- Improper equipment clean-up and disposal of chemicals can result in dangerous chemical exposure to humans and the environment, as well as equipment damage.

Storage

When not in use, store indoors. For long term or winter storage, prepare by running **RV antifreeze** (DO NOT USE automotive antifreeze) through the system. This will keep internal parts lubricated, protect against corrosion, and keep the unit from freezing.

CAUTION

- The pump will be damaged if it freezes.
- Protect the pump from freezing during storage by following the instructions below.

Preparing for storage:

1. Flush with water	Fill the pump with fresh water and run through the system. Operate the pump system until the system is completely flushed.		
	DO NOT add antifreeze before flushing the system as bleach can react with antifreeze.

Troubleshooting

▲ WARNING

Before troubleshooting or attempting to service, read the following safety rules to avoid accidental exposure to chemical and also risk of electric shock.

Note: A reserve, clean container should be kept for use when the sprayer tank needs to be emptied temporarily for repairs. It is advisable to purchase a reserve tank from Northern Tool and Equipment for use in these circumstances. The container should be properly labeled as to its contents if it is used. In addition, it may be advisable to empty the tank contents using a transfer pump if the tank drain hole is inaccessible.

Maintenance

In the event of an internal pump cartridge leak, the pump will shut off to protect the motor and the LED light will turn on to indicate the problem.

To repair the pump, use the replacement pump cartridge number corresponding with the model number.



To remove the old pump cartridge from the motor:

- 1. Disconnect power to the pump and be sure all system pressure is relieved.
- 2. Disconnect quick connect fittings from pump ports.
- 3. Disconnect both red wires from the pressure switch.
- 4. Disconnect black plug from the pump motor.
- 5. Using the supplied hex wrench, unthread the **silver** mounting screws (black screws can remain installed).
- 6. Slide the pump cartridge off the shaft of the motor. Discard the pump cartridge.
- 7. Dry any wet areas of the motor before installing new pump cartridge.


To install the new pump cartridge:

- 1. Line up the holes in the pump cartridge to the holes in the motor face.
- 2. Slide the pump cartridge onto the shaft of the motor.
- 3. Using the supplied hex wrench, secure the pump cartridge using the new mounting screws supplied with the pump cartridge.
- 4. Attach the red wire from the back of the motor to the back spade of the pressure switch.
- 5. Attach the red wire from the 2-pin connector to the front spade of the pressure switch.
- 6. Attach the black plug from the pump cartridge to the pump motor.
- 7. Reconnect power to the pump and reconnect quick connect fittings.
- 8. Test system for leaks with water.





Exploded View and Parts Breakdown – Rev B





Limited Warranty

Dear Valued Customer:

Treat this unit like the high-quality piece of machinery it is. Neglect and improper handling may impair its performance. Limited Warranty

NorthStar shall warranty any piece of equipment manufactured, or parts of equipment manufactured, to be free from defects in material or workmanship for a period of 2 years for noncommercial/nonrental use and a period of 90 days for commercial/rental use from the date of purchase by user.

NorthStar shall warranty any wear item to be free from defects in material or workmanship for a period of 90 days from the date of purchase by user. NorthStar can supply you with the service center location in your area.

This warranty specifically excludes the following; failure of parts due to damage caused by accident, fire, flood, windstorm, acts of God, applications not approved by NorthStar in writing, corrosion caused by chemicals, use of replacement parts which do not conform to manufacturer's specifications, and damage caused by vandalism. Additional exclusions: loss of running time, inconvenience, loss of income, or loss of use, including any implied warranty of merchantability of fitness for a specific use.
